

A Beautiful FRIENDSHIP

A young girl stands at the bottom of the slide. She has already taken her turn, but instead of running to get back in line or to the next activity, she's waiting patiently for her friend. A moment later, a young boy emerges from the end of the slide. As he finishes his ride, the girl takes him by the hand and carefully guides him to another spot on the playground.

Skylar and Josiah are two students at The Chicago Lighthouse's Ray and Judy McCaskey Preschool. Their friendship embodies the values of acceptance, understanding, and empathy that we teach all of our students, and that we see every day.

When Josiah first enrolled at the Preschool, he was timid and shy. Legally blind, Josiah was in unfamiliar territory and wasn't sure how to navigate his new surroundings or how to engage with the students around him. Luckily, Skylar was there. A second-year sighted student, Skylar knew the ropes. The young girl took it upon herself to help Josiah adjust to his new surroundings and friends. She would help him find activities during free choice and clean-up. On the playground, she helped him navigate the maze of structures.



The friendship of Josiah, who is blind, and Skylar, who is sighted, is built on empathy and understanding.

As Skylar and Josiah's friendship blossomed, the boy became more confident. Over the school year, he has taken the initiative in activities, even when Skylar is not around. He has become more outgoing with other classmates and showing more independence overall.

"Skylar and Josiah's bond teaches a critical lesson of empathy," says their teacher, Miss Abby. "These skills are so important to teach at an early age because they reinforce how kids live their lives and treat others in the future."

Our Story

hirty-four years ago, a small group of women living in Chicagoland on the North Shore joined together with the purpose of fundraising to support The Chicago Lighthouse and raising awareness of the agency's programs and efforts to aid those who are blind or visually impaired.

That's the official story. And it's true. But it's only part of the story. What really happened is what happens all of the time: one among us is touched by the incurable pain of a baby's diagnosis. Then the strength of close friendships and the commitment of a loyal few join together to make a difference in the life of that single child. That is how, and that is why, the Associate Board was formed over a quarter of a century ago.

What keeps the Associate Board committed has moved beyond a single child and extends to all children served by The Chicago Lighthouse. There is minimal state funding awarded to The Chicago Lighthouse to help educate and ease the particular issues parents face when raising a blind infant. How do you teach babies to roll, to crawl, or to walk when they cannot see? How do you teach a blind toddler to navigate the house, or the playground? Each year our House & Garden Walk raises money to support the Lighthouse program that sends trained teachers to individual homes to help families succeed through these early stages of childhood.

We are women who, in the midst of raising our own families, have joined together to help others raise theirs. And we are women who welcome those who would like to join us.

We welcome you to our 34th Annual House & Garden Walk. We hope that you will enjoy this year's virtual tour, and we thank you for your support.

Remembering Jeanie



Our annual House & Garden Walk offers glimpses into extraordinary homes. To be sure, many elements combine to make a home special. It might be the architecture, or the furnishings, or the landscaping.

But what brings a home to life, and what gives it its soul, are the people who live there and who sit around those lovely tables, eating and laughing and connecting with one another.

For those of you who have previously attended our House & Garden Walks, you likely remember the lavish array of sweets at the Hospitality House. Year after year, it was our beloved Jeanie Coleman whose prowess as a baker, and grace as a hostess, set both the tone and the table for our patrons.

Though we lost Jeanie in 2015, her commitment to our cause lives on. What also lives on is a collective devotion to her signature recipe.

In a tribute to Jeanie, we are pleased to provide the recipe to her magic brownie bars. Bake up a batch! There is no sweeter way to honor her.

32

8-layered Brownies with Toasted Marshmallow Topping

Ingredients:

- Pillsbury or Nestlé Toll House ready-to-bake cookie dough (best with chocolate chips; I prefer toffee bar crunch by Poppie's Dough, but use what you like)
- Butterscotch chips
- Toffee chips
- Almond toffee chips
- HEATH toffee bits
- REESE's peanut butter chips
- Milk chocolate chips or white chocolate chips (use sparingly)
- Mini semi-sweet chocolate chips
- Mini marshmallows
- Caramel sauce

Preheat oven to 350°. Generously butter a 9 x 13" baking dish. Cut cookie dough (disc size) into ½ inch slices & cover entire bottom of dish. Bake for approximately 9 minutes. Remove from the oven & layer each kind of chip on top of another - I only use ½ bag of almond toffee chips. Otherwise, evenly distribute. Top with mini semi-sweet chocolate chips & lastly, layer some mini marshmallows to cover everything. Bake for another 22 minutes until golden brown. Remove from oven. Melt caramel sauce & drizzle on top of the hot brownies – I use a squeeze bottle for this. Cool overnight before cutting. Do not refrigerate. ENJOY!






