

Android Zoom & Magnifier App Tips

Screen Magnification on Android Phone or Tablet:

Setting up Screen Magnification

 Go to Settings, then Accessibility, then Vision Enhancements, then Magnification. Once in Magnification, choose and enable Triple Tap Magnify. Disable any other options if applicable.

To magnify the screen anywhere:

- Triple tap with 1 finger quickly in the desired area and it will zoom in.
- While it is zoomed in, use 2 fingers to pinch in and out to increase/decrease how big it is.
- Use 2 fingers to pull the screen while it is zoomed in to see more of the screen since our field of view has shrunk to make things larger.
- When done, use 1 finger to triple tap again and it will turn off.
- You may also triple tap and hold with one finger on the third tap to temporarily zoom in. You can hold your finger on the screen and drag it around and it will stay zoomed in until you remove your finger from the screen.

Magnifier Application Tips for Android Phone/Tablet:

Installation: Our recommended app is weZoom. To begin installation, navigate to your Play Store app. Dictate or type weZoom in the search bar. Once you find weZoom Magnifier, tap the install button. Once downloading is complete, the install

button will turn into an Open button you can tap. You can also now find the weZoom app in your app list.

Using weZoom:

- Point the camera of your phone at text or an item.
- Zoom in by dragging one finger upward on the screen.
- Zoom out by dragging one finger downward on the screen.
- If the image looks blurry or out of focus, tap the screen to have the image sharpen.
- There are 5 buttons along the bottom of the screen. From left to right, they are:
 - A switch to hide or expose the other 4 buttons. This looks like an oval with a dot in it.
 - A flashlight button. This looks like a circle with a lightbulb in it.
 - A freeze button. This looks like a circle with a pause icon in it. The purpose of this is to temporarily take a picture while you study it. To unfreeze, tap this button once more. Note this button turns into a circle with a play icon in it when successfully frozen.
 - A contrast button. This looks like a circle with the letter "A" in it. The purpose of this is to change colors of text & backgrounds while reading for those with contrast sensitivity. Each time you press this button the color combination will change. You can continue to press this button until it rotates back to the default option.
 - The final button is one to access more settings. This looks like a circle with 3 vertical dots. Once pressed, a menu opens with more buttons. These are to explore customizable settings, restore to defaults, get help, and adjust light exposure.
